dated 28 April 1674, proved 5 August 1674

In the name of God Amen. The last will & testament of **Peter Elder** being in pfect sense and memory I do bequeath my soul to God and my body to the earth ~ I do bequeath my sonn **Peter Elder** unto **Mr. Richard Peacock**, he being my sons Godfather whom I have made choice of above all others and as for what stock of cattle I have I give to my son **Peter**, and a heifer of three years old due by bill from **John Arnold** due to be paid according to bill – and as for what stock of cattle I give to my son **Peter**, **Mr. Peacock** to have the benefit of them until my sonn comes to be one and twenty {page 162} years of age **Mr. Peacock** to have the male and my sonne the female and as for my Plantation and all moveable goods etc **Mr. Peacock** to take into his custody until the boy comes to be one and twenty In this appoint my loving friend **Mr. Richard Peacock** to bee my Executor in full in whole and to the true fform and of this my last Will & Testament I sett my hand and seal this 28th of April 1674
